

Itinerary for international Templar meetings and Templar gathering, in Scotland, 1999.

April 14th, to April 21st, 1999, Glasgow, Scotland.

Wednesday 14th, April 1999

Arrival and registration at the Normandy or Dean Park Hotels. One of the Scottish Templars shall be on hand to welcome you to Scotland. You will be expected to complete your fee payment at this time, if it is still outstanding. As most of you will be flying in from abroad and probably feeling tired after your long trip, there will be an assembly in the Normandy at 8 o'clock p.m. to allow us all to get to know each other. Your itinerary for the week will be explained fully at this gathering. The details are still to be decided yet.

Thursday 15th, April, 1999

Coach trips to Inverary Castle, Kilmory, Kilmartin, and Loch Awe. Details of trip will be provided later. Suffice to say for the present, it will be rich in Templar history and structure.

1000 hours - Departure time. Packed lunch will be provided for this trip.

1700 hours - Return to Hotel

2000 hours - Evening entertainment. Ceilidh and Buffet. Cash bar available.

Coach trip to visit Paisley, Roslin Chapel, where Templar relics will be on display, including the ring of Hugh de Payens, by kind permission of Chevalier Robert Brydon, KOCT, Hereditary keeper of the artifacts, Edinburgh Castle, St Giles Cathedral, the Royal Mile etc. As there are plenty of places to eat in Edinburgh, lunch will not be provided this trip.

Non Delegates Free day to shop, etc. Coaches will be laid on to take you to Glasgow in the morning, and a pick-up place and time will be given to you, for your return to the Hotel, as you leave the coach. 1730 hours - The coaches will depart the Hotel for Paisley Abbey.
1800 hours - Investiture of New Knights and Dames in Paisley Abbey. On the completion of the service, the Knights and flames will walk in procession from the Abbey to the Town Hall (distance 70 yards), where there will be cloakroom facilities, plus a room will be available to leave mantles.
